: Campaign finance; Representation and legislative polarization; Legislative elections and institutions; Congress and state legislatures I am working on a book project: Representation in the American Legislatures: Congress and the State Legislatures. I have conducted two national surveys of state legislators and one of Congressional staff and interviewed members of Congress and state legislatures. I have collected data on their districts, such as, census and religion data, their fundraising, their election contests and details of their legislative service, leadership and committee roles and bill sponsorship and votes. I have presented preliminary work at conferences on the following topics: measuring the power of legislative leaders, measuring the district liberalism-conservatism of constituents, general election voters and primary voters (2022 best paper award), soft money donations, legislative bipartisanship, and a paper applying the measures of ideology of district general election and primary voters to examine the extent to which legislator ideology represents primary voters rather than general election voters. The book will include other forms of representation such as casework and pork. I hope to write a second book using the same material with a different focus: Legislative Institutions: Leaders and Committees in Congress and the State Legislatures.
